## **<u>A Pastoral Note</u>**

It is noted that the COVID-19 (formerly referred to as the Coronavirus) is currently at a low risk of transmission in Australia with limited human to human transmission in Australia to date. This does not mean that there has been no impact upon people in our local and wider Australian Communities. Fear founded upon false information or that connects with unjust behaviours like racism are possible when we do not have reliable information and when we forget to see one another as children of God. We must first ensure that we treat everyone in our society with compassion, recognising that for some, they are feeling especially vulnerable because of assumptions about COVID-19; some members of our wider communities may even have experienced racism unjustly linked to COVID-19.

Second, there are a variety of practices we can utilise that are appropriate pastoral responses as well as assistance for limiting any possible transmissions of COVID-19 or colds/flu. We have established at each one of our sites and for activities of BCRC, the recommended Antiseptic Hand Gel so members/visitors can feel comfortable cleaning their hands. If you are about to sneeze or cough, use a tissue or cough into the sleeve of your jacket/shirt. If you are feeling unwell, be gentle with yourself and rest at home.

As worshipping congregations, we will be suspending the practice of Passing the Peace until further notice; this is largely due to pastoral concerns to ensure that members who do feel a level of dis-ease may not feel compelled to shake hands. The welcomers/worship leaders/ministers will still greet people at the doors, but not offer handshakes. I wish to underline that this is being put into place mostly for pastoral reasons and not for any major concerns regarding transmission of COVID-19.
